$>$ A reminder that $\mathbf{4 0}$ hours of Community Involvement is a diploma requirement for graduating students. Deadline for the hours is June $1^{\text {st }}, 2019$.

## ilead

Ilead is going strong, having already gone to two events, and three more planned for the rest of the 2018-2019 year. The goal of iLead is to produce indigenous student leaders in our community. The little "I" represents the fact that Leadership skills more important than ourselves alone.
So far, we have participated in two workshops on Oct 11th and Nov 6th both at the North Grenville Municipal Centre in Kemptville, where we met other iLead students from high schools, across the Upper Canada School Board.
At the first workshop, we met First Nations Knowledge Keepers David Jock and Frances Derouchie, who gave traditional teachings about the Medicine Wheel and the four sacred Medicines. The students completed a Medicine Wheel craft reflecting the knowledge they had learned, to bring home with them.
At the second workshop, we met Patrick Cheechoo, a Mushkego artist from Constance Lake First Nation, Mr. Cheechoo likes to teach about living off the land along with Cree traditions and ceremony. He loves painting, photography and creating with vector- and pixel-based computer applications and his paintings have been sold to collectors all over the world including the U.S., England, China and Australia. He finds inspiration in the outdoors - seeing geese fly by, or a loon calling on a calm lake. He likes to tell stories while painting; one of the ones we heard that day was the legend of how the loon got its spots. Mr. Cheechoo guided the students through creating their own painting, which the students brought home with them, framed.

Any student with any First Nations, Metis or Inuit heritage, in grades 9-12, is invited. All costs, including transportation, meals and the activities are free. If interested in joining us for our next event on December 17, please speak to Miss Cranstone in Room 157.

## Link Crew

LINK CREW is a grade 12 peer-helping course where grade 12 's assist grade 9's with the smooth transition into high school. LINK Crew organizes events such as Grade 9 Day, Grade 9 breakfasts, one-on-one math tutoring with the Intermediate classes, sports fundraisers, fun activity days, Tai Chi Club, Intramurals at lunch and the Variety Show.

The Community Living Program at RDHS has been quite active to start the school year. We have welcomed a couple of new students to our program. During period 2 this semester, we have focused on Language Development and will work on Numeracy next semester. During periods 3 and 4, students have been Exploring the World of Work and Exploring the World. The students have made regular excursions into the community to use facilities at the YMCA, and the Clarence-Rockland Public Library, as well as to frequent local businesses.
One way students have been preparing for the world of work, is by assuming responsibility for the RDHS Breakfast Program. They have developed their organization, teamwork, and food-safety skills by preparing healthy foods for students to eat when they arrive at school. In addition to regular breakfast staples like bagels with cream cheese, cereal/oatmeal, and fruit, the students have foods like grilled-cheese sandwiches, French toast, cheese curds, and yogurt parfaits to the menu. They regularly provide lunches for student who might need them. Breakfast Program is an important and popular program for RDHS students.
The CLP students have also been preparing for the world of work is by completing work placements two half-days per week at our partners RKPS and Shopper's Drug Mart. Work Placement is a valuable opportunity for our students to experience the work outside of the classroom environment with appropriate supports.
